


Prayer for Spiritual Communion





Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel offers a contrast to many of the messages we hear in our society today. If we were to accept uncritically the "get ahead" messages of our culture, we would think that happiness means having money, being successful, having many possessions, and so on. When we think this way, we are not unlike the people who heard Jesus teach on the day that he taught the Beatitudes. The crowd that day also associated happiness with material possessions and status.

The beatitudes are some of the most consoling and encouraging words in the gospels, and a reminder of God's desire to care for us when we are at our most broken down. Life can be full of challenges, heartbreak, and drudgery. Jesus desires to meet us precisely in that slog, promising us that the kingdom of God is there. Trusting in the love and mercy of God will be with us in whatever difficulties life presents.

The letter to the Corinthians should give us hope as we accept this call. Paul reminds us that God chooses the foolish of the world, the weak of the world, and the lowly of the world. God gives us everything we need to respond to God's invitation, even when we doubt ourselves.

Let us pray that we may use the gifts God has given us to bring about God's kingdom in our world today.
