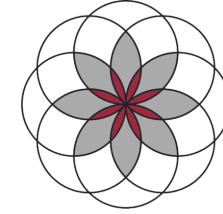


Prayer for Spiritual Communion

Dear Friends,

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. The reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiving of sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people.

As Jesus himself says, the world “neither sees nor knows it” (John 14:17). However, Paul states in the second reading, “No one can say ‘Jesus is Lord’, except by the Holy Spirit.” Whether we recognize it or not, whenever we turn to God, it is because the Holy Spirit is already at work in us. Out of the persons of the Trinity, it is particularly the holy Spirit that dwells in our hearts, drawing us into relationship with God and with others.

Greeting the disciples in the locked room, Jesus's first words are, “Peace be with you.” Where in your life have you recognized peace as a fruit of the Holy Spirit? Where do you remain in need of God's peace?
