Dear Friends,

Today's gospel addresses a reality that we often encounter in our world today. When confronted with a man experiencing blindness, Jesus's disciples question what type of sin could have possibly caused this lack of sight. When we encounter difficulties today – whether disability or illness or loss – it is not uncommon to think, “God must be punishing me for my sins.” We must remember Jesus's response to the disciples' question: “Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him.” Each of us can make the works of God visible through us in the unique circumstances and relationships of our lives. This is even true during difficult times.

We don't know what we don't know, and often we find that we cannot heal our own blindness – this is a task for Jesus and those around us. In the silence of prayer, God can open our eyes to the ways in which we choose against God's love for us. Other people can also help us see more clearly, and we have that same responsibility to be “light in the Lord” for the people in our lives.

What does Jesus want us to see and to believe this day? What do we need to remember this day? Where are our blind spots? Where do we need to work for change in our world? What is God's amazing grace doing in our lives right now?
