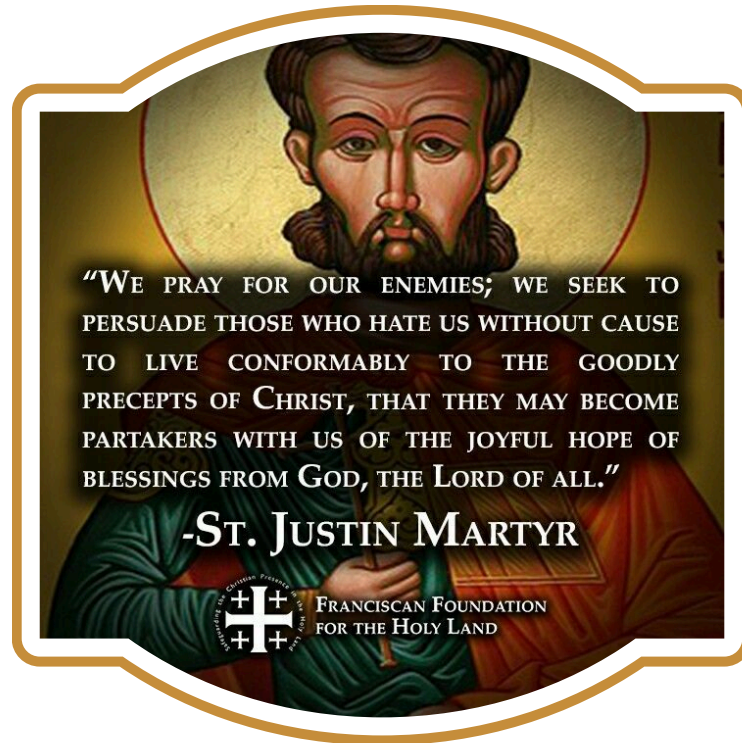

Dear Friends,

The mystery of the Trinity is grounded in the relationship of the Father, Son, and Spirit. The very nature of God is relational, and we are invited into this relationship of love. Paul gives us some insight or advice for this relationship: Seek reparation and reconciliation. Live in peace. Encourage and support each other. In cultivating right relationship with others, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit" will be with us.

Today's focus on the mystery of the Holy Trinity calls our attention to the action of God, who reveals himself in three persons: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God the Father, out of love for the world, sent his Son into the world in order to save it. Through the death and resurrection of the Son, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit. As three persons, God acts always as a God of love; he does not condemn the world but acts to save it.

Do you pray most often to the Father, the Son, or the Holy Spirit?
How can you find meaningful ways to grow in relationship with all persons of God?

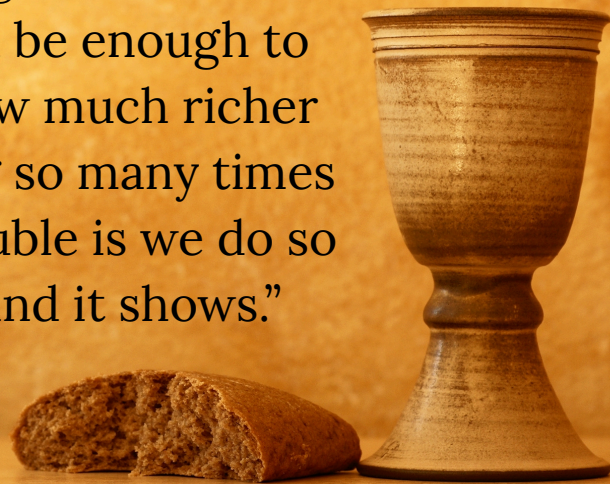

Dear Friends,

In Jesus' day, bread was made with rough flour along with other ingredients that came from God's creation: water, spices, yeast, honey. The dough—made from flour and carrying our prayers—rises, is baked, and becomes something else. The materials the baker started with changed into something else.

In the making of this bread, its ingredients changed form. Our hearts were also transformed by our communal prayer. This is what happens in the Eucharist. Through the action of the Holy Spirit, the “work of our hands” is transformed into the presence of Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis beautifully spoke to this reality: “The Eucharist is the sacrament of communion that brings us out of individualism so that we may follow him together, living out our faith in him. Therefore, we should all ask ourselves before the Lord: how do I live the Eucharist? Do I live anonymously or as a moment of true communion with the Lord, and also with all the brothers and sisters who share the same banquet?” (Homily, May 30, 2013)

When we receive the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist, it becomes a very part of ourselves. Nourished by Christ, we are called to be Christ. Nourished by love, we are called to be love. The self-gift of Jesus Christ allows us to give of ourselves for others. In today's celebration of the body and blood of Christ echoes our celebration of the Most Holy Trinity last week. God invites us into relationship. How will you respond?
