Are you old enough to remember life before zip codes? If so, you're old enough to also remember a milestone moment in St. Ann's history.

The US Postal Service introduced the 5-digit code in 1963 to help mail travel more efficiently. Now a routine part of mailing, the zip code was considered a major innovation for improving the mail system.

That same year, another innovation was happening locally: St. Ann's Home opened its new building on Portland Avenue. In 1963, the nine-story structure was a marvel of its age, a symbol of St. Ann's growing reputation as Rochester's leading senior-care provider.

Now, we are about to embark on the next step in our evolution: a transformational project and capital campaign that will ensure we remain at the forefront in providing today's seniors what they want – and deserve – as they age.

Here Are Some Important Events in Our History.

1963

St. Ann's Home opens its doors in a new nine-story building on Portland Avenue. Offering private rooms with private bathrooms, it is considered state of the art.

2007

In anticipation of a growing senior population, St. Ann's opens its community at Cherry Ridge. It quickly becomes the first choice for senior living in Webster.

1873

St. Ann's founded by the Sisters of St. Joseph.

1997

Chapel Oaks becomes one of the area's first freestanding senior communities, setting the standard for quality in independent senior housing.

2013

St. Ann's expands choices in senior care with the opening of the Wegman Care Center and Leo Center for Caring on the Portland Avenue campus and St. Ann's Care Center in Webster.
